IN HONOR OFMOTHERS' DAY

Question: "What does the Bible say about Christian mothers?"

Answer: Being a mother is a very important role that the Lord chooses to give to many women. A Christian mother is told to love her children (<u>Titus 2:4-5</u>), in part so that she does not bring reproach on the Lord and on the Savior whose name she bears.

Children are a gift from the Lord (Psalm 127:3-5).

In <u>Titus 2:4</u>, the Greek word *philoteknos* appears in reference to mothers loving their children. This word represents a special kind of "mother love." The idea that flows out of this word is that of caring for our children, nurturing them, affectionately embracing them, meeting their needs, and tenderly befriending each one as a unique gift from the hand of God. The Bible never states that every woman should be a mother. However, it does say that those whom the Lord blesses to be mothers should take the responsibility seriously. Mothers have a unique and crucial role in the lives of their children. Motherhood is not a chore or unpleasant task. Just as a mother bears a child during pregnancy, and just as a mother feeds and cares for a child during infancy, so mothers also play an ongoing role in the lives of their children. whether they are adolescents, teenagers, young adults, or even adults with children of their own. While the role of motherhood must change and develop, the love, care, nurture, and encouragement a mother gives should never cease.

Several things are commanded of Christian mothers in God's Word:

Availability - morning, noon, and night (Deuteronomy 6:6-7)

Involvement - interacting, discussing, thinking, and processing life together (Ephesians 6:4)

Teaching - the Scriptures and a biblical worldview (Psalm 78:5-6; Deuteronomy 4:10; Ephesians 6:4)

Training - helping a child to develop skills and discover his/her strengths (Proverbs 22:6) and spiritual gifts (Romans 12:3-8 and 1 Corinthians 12)

Discipline - teaching the fear of the Lord, drawing the line consistently, lovingly, firmly (<u>Ephesians</u> <u>6:4; Hebrews 12:5-11; Proverbs</u> <u>13:24; 19:18; 22:15; 23:13-14; 29:15-17</u>)

Nurture - providing an environment of constant verbal support, freedom to fail, acceptance, affection, unconditional love (<u>Titus 2:4</u>; <u>2 Timothy</u> <u>1:7</u>; <u>Ephesians 4:29-32</u>; <u>5:1-2</u>; <u>Galatians 5:22</u>; <u>1</u> <u>Peter 3:8-9</u>)

Modeling with Integrity - living what you say, being a model from which a child can learn by "catching" the essence of godly living (Deuteronomy 4:9, <u>15</u>, <u>23</u>; <u>Proverbs</u> <u>10:9</u>; <u>11:3</u>; <u>Psalm 37:18</u>, <u>37</u>).

One of the principal days of the Christian year, celebrated on the fiftieth day after Easter. The Greek word pentecoste means "fiftieth day." Pentecost is the day on which the Christian church commemorates the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and others assembled in Jerusalem. It marks the beginning of the Christian church and the proclamation of its message throughout the world and is often referred to as the birthday of the church. The liturgical color for Pentecost is red. Traditionally, Pentecost has been a day for baptisms. Because it was the custom in the early church for persons being baptized to wear white robes or clothing, the day also became known as Whitsunday, a contraction of white Sunday.

The end of school is now in sight! I wish to take this time to congratulate the seniors and pray for their continued success in the next phase of their lives.


