





Thanksgiving is observed on the last Thursday in November

President Lincoln made a proclamation marking Thursday, November 26, 1863, as Thanksgiving. Lincoln's proclamation was expressing gratitude to God and thanks to the Army for emerging successfully from the Battle of Gettysburg. He enumerated the blessings of the American people and called upon his countrymen to "set apart and observe the last Thursday of November as a day of Thanksgiving and Praise."

In 1939, President Franklin D. Roosevelt changed Thanksgiving from the last Thursday in November to the second-to-last Thursday. However, many people continued to celebrate Thanksgiving on the last Thursday in November.

In 1941, to end any confusion, the president and Congress established Thanksgiving as a United States federal holiday to be celebrated on the fourth Thursday in November, which is how it stands today! Thanksgiving is observed on the last Thursday in November
